### Out with the Old, In with the New

Housing Corporation Announces Major Renovation Campaign

uring a special Sigma Nu alumni meeting in Peoria, Illinois, this past October, Housing Corporation President Wes Zobrist '06 (ZΦ1023) announced the *Campaign for Sigma Nu*, which will work to completely renovate the Zeta Phi chapter house at Bradley by the fall 2022 semester.

Wes stated, "As we all know, many of the other leading fraternities at Bradley have modernized and invested in their houses. After 60 years, our fraternity house has become worn and unsafe and is in need of a complete renovation. At the same time, it is necessary to provide additional new space for the next generation of Sigma Nus to compete as a top-tier fraternity at Bradley."

Five years ago, a careful inspection revealed the house was deteriorating, but the infrastructure was sound and reusable. A plan emerged to establish a campaign committee of alumni to raise funds to rehabilitate and reuse the existing house for a major renovation project.

Campaign Chairman Gary Bergman '69 ( $Z\Phi340$ ) announced that a core group of 42 alumni has already raised \$950,000 of the \$1,750,000 needed for the *Campaign for Sigma Nu*. Now, the Housing Corporation needs to secure an additional \$800,000 in gifts from over 1,000  $\Sigma$ N

alumni to complete the renovation project scheduled for the summer of 2022.

To date, all sleeping rooms and bathrooms, as well as the kitchen and other major areas, have been renovated. All doors and windows and many electrical, plumbing, and internet systems have been upgraded. As soon as additional funds are secured, a new porch and front entryway will be completed in addition to enclosing a two-story area over the old pit.

All gifts to the campaign, using a special pledge form, can be made directly to Bradley University, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, and are tax deductible for all donors. "We must order materials soon and schedule construction for summer 2022. We are looking forward to hearing from all alumni. All donor names will be included on the permanent list of contributors that will be displayed in the house," Wes added.
